HSGS Web Site. < www.rootsweb.com/~usgenweb/mi/iosco/3501hsgs.htm> is the address for our HSGS's indexes on the Internet. The search engine for this site, or all of Michigan or any of the other Michigan's counties is www.rootsweb.com/~usgenweb/mi/search.htm. We currently have (July 31 2006) 946 indexes, 24,338 printed pages, and 1,081,131 names indexed. All these files are on HSGS's master file & the CD we sell, but only about 94% are on the web site (does not include new indexes within the last month, draft indexes not yet finished, & a some random data corrections). Finding Genealogies. Always, always, always use the catalog to find genealogies. While they are usually on the shelf in alphabetical order, many books contain information on more than one family and may not be shelved under the name you are looking for. Beware of the same book hiding under different titles. Look for older (or more updated) versions of the genealogy.

Rating a Genealogy. Remember that even many of the most revered genealogical scholars published books without citing sources in the book. When using a book that does not cite its sources, check to see if the author has left his/her papers to a society for preservation. You will often find source citations there.

Just because a genealogy does not have an index does not mean it is not useful. Look for potential warning signs (e.g. supposed descents from Adam and Eve). If someone continues to propagate lineages that have already been proven false, it casts doubt on all the information in the book! (eNews v8n30 July 26 2006)

\$1,000 Reward for Ellis Island's Little Orphan Annie. Noted genealogist Megan Smolenyak Smolenyak is offering a \$1,000 reward for anyone who has documented evidence of what became of Annie Moore, Ellis Island's first immigrant. Annie arrived at Ellis Island from Ireland with her brothers, Anthony and Philip, on January 1, 1892. She was greeted with much fanfare and given a \$10 gold coin. Since then, she's been commemorated in statues at both Ellis Island and the Cobh Heritage Centre in Ireland, and has crept into American national lore.

Important Dates for US Passenger Lists, by Michael J. Leclerc:

1800-1819	Beginning of US Passenger Lists with keeping of Baggage Lists (mostly Philadelphia).
1820-ca 1900	Customs Passenger Lists start being kept.
1882	Administrative control of immigration placed under the Secretary of the Treasury.
1893	First major changes to 1819 law. Information on passenger lists was now to include: Name, Age, Sex, Marital Status, Calling or Occupation, Ability to Read or Write, Nationality, Last Residence, Port of US Entry, Final Destination, Whether Possessing a Ticket to Final Destination, Whether Immigrant Paid Own Passage, Whether in Possession of Money, Whether Upwards of \$30 or How Much if Less Than \$30, Whether Going to Join a Relative and if so What Relative as well as Their Name and Address, Whether Immigrant had Ever Been in US Before and if so When and Where, Whether Ever in Prison, Almshouse, or on Charity, Whether a Polygamist, Whether Under Contract to Perform Labor in US, and Mental and Physical Health Status
1903	Category of Race added.
1906	Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization established. Manifests were now to carry a personal description of each immigrant and their birthplace, not just country of allegiance.
1907	Name and address of the nearest relative in the country from which the immigrant came.
